

But perhaps you say, “I’ve heard it all before. It is high blown theory without any basis in reality.”

Oh, you’re wrong, my friend, you’re wrong. You need to look up! We look not at the things that are seen but at the things that are not seen: for the things that are seen are temporal, but the things that are not seen are eternal. *“We all with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord”* (II Cor. 4:18 & 3:18)

Spend Time with Him

So start today spending time beholding *“the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ”* (II Cor. 4:6). Spend much time daily alone with Him, seeking Him alone in secret prayer not for any of His gifts nor even for spiritual victory—just for Himself.

Look in His face. Love Him, Worship Him. Praise Him. Adore Him. Rest in Him. Trust Him. Depend on Him. Rejoice in Him. Thank Him. Honor Him. Glorify Him. Let Him be God. Look lovingly into His face. And I

promise you, if you give Him your time and devotion hour after hour, day after day, week after week, month after month, year after year, and He will change you from glory to glory by the Spirit of the Lord. This is not an easy path to glory. But anyone who ever offered you one is lying to you.
