Lastly, Peter admonishes the reader to give diligence to ensure our calling and election.

Suffice it to say diligence is essential!

"Beloved, when I gave all diligence to write unto you of the common salvation, it was needful for me to write unto you, and exhort you that ye should earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints." (Jude 1:3)

Believers are told to earnestly contend for the true faith. This was such a pressing issue for Jude that he diligently wrote of the need to fight for truth.

God is not looking for wimpy soldiers in His army!

Conclusion:

The Bible is quite clear that diligence is required in many aspects of the life of a follower of Jesus. "Diligence" is defined as:

Speed, by implication eagerness, earnestness.

his sight, and wilt give ear to his commandments, and keep all his statutes, I will put none of these diseases upon thee, which I have brought upon the Egyptians: for I am the Lord that healeth thee."

(Exodus 15:26)

**Assure Your Calling - Diligently** 

"And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; (6) And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; (7) And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity. (8) For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that **ye shall** neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. (9) But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins. (10) Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall:" (2 Peter 1:5-10)

These instructions from Peter deserve in-depth Bible study. For this brief writing, we will make a few critical observations. First, we see Peter calling for us to diligently add to our faith and grow spiritually. Diligently working on these aspects of spiritual maturity guarantees that our lives will be fruitful.
