A wacco! It could well be argued that the waccos are those who don't have enough sense to want to trade in present pain and sorrow for eternal bliss. We need to get as straight as Paul was on this whole matter.

It's time for the church to preach again the everlasting joys of heaven, the eternal suffering of hell, and personal responsibility to God.

God is the beginning and end. We are to put Him first in all things. We are to be His ambassadors offering eternal life to all. Unabashedly longing to be with Him in eternal bliss is a great way to point them to Him.
