flowing out into unquenchable love to others?

What makes the difference?

NOT: --Looking to the outward trappings of your religion. –Seeking to perform up to religious standards. –Longing for the approval of church people. –Trying to be good enough to get God's approval. – Putting your hope in correct doctrine and strained obedience, or in feelings and experiences for Christian growth and victory.

BUT: --Looking directly to the Lord Himself. –Seeking to love the Lord alone. –Accepting your position in Christ and all that He longs to give you in Himself and of Himself. -- Hoping in the Lord alone for more and more to be given you of HIM-SELF as your life and victory.

Give yourself to seeking Him, loving Him, desiring Him, hoping in Him, communing with Him in the simplicity of love. Let there grow simply and spontaneously out of this the desire to trust Him, please

Him, yield to Him, obey Him, and serve Him and others.


