Francis Ridley Havergals' father was a pastor, and wrote and published church music.

When she was three she began to read. At four she was reading the Bible. By seven she began to keep a notebook of her poetry.

But life was not easy. She was sick most of her life. Her mother died when she was eleven. She finally received her assurance of salvation at the age of fifteen after three years of earnest struggle.

She always believed in God and became moved by His death for us, but felt her sin was too great. When she fully accepted God's love and trusted Christ's payment for her sins, she found peace.

Francis learned Greek, Hebrew, Latin, German, French and Italian.

She memorized most of the New Testament, as well as Psalms, Isaiah and the Minor Prophets.

She taught a children's Sunday School class, visited the poor and ill, and had a ministry of writing books and corresponding with those in need.

Despite her sufferings she always found cause to praise her Lord and challenge others to serve Him.
